Maximum Amount Allowed per Grant: \$500.00

Grant Awards will be determined by the Grand River Mutual Board of Directors. Priority funding will be given to projects that benefit the largest percentage of your community members. Those projects might include: developing public libraries, aiding ambulance and fire districts, constructing community buildings, etc.
